

YOUTH SUMMIT: TRANSFORMING EDUCATION IN SOUTHEAST ASIA

Background

Transforming education becomes more meaningful with the active engagement and involvement of the young people. This was the essence of the Youth Declaration that was launched during the September 2022 Transforming Education Summit. It outlines the collective vision and commitments from the youth sector on how to transform education which was an outcome of an extensive consultation process involving nearly half a million youth from over 170 countries. Touted as a global movement, it was grounded on the leadership of young people collaboration with other key education stakeholders.

We must push forward together, with a focus on tangible actions where it matters most. on the ground, in the classroom, and in the experience of teachers and learners alike."
