



# **OVERVIEW**

National Book Week is an annual event promoting the love of reading, enhancing literacy, and celebrating literature and Filipino culture. Reflecting on the nine decades of the celebration allows us to look back at the significant achievements and milestones in promoting literacy and a love for reading while honoring the contributions of authors, educators, librarians & libraries, and advocates who have shaped our literary landscape. This underscores the resilience and evolution of the celebration, highlighting its role in cultural preservation and fostering national pride through Filipino literature. By examining past challenges and successes, we draw valuable lessons to inform future initiatives, inspire new generations, and set strategic goals, ensuring that the legacy of National Book Week continues to unify communities and champion the transformative power of books for years to come.

# **Objectives**

This year's theme aims to go back to the core objective of the celebration, which is to cultivate a love for reading and inspire dreams and creativity through literature while celebrating its  $90^{\circ}$  anniversary. Specifically, it aims to:

- 1. Intensify the promotion of literacy and reading habits.
- 2. Enhance access to books and educational resources.
- 3. Highlight the importance of reading and literacy in achieving dreams and shaping the nation.
- 4. Celebrate the program's achievements and milestones to inspire new generations.

# **Expected outcomes**

At the end of the program, the following are expected

- Increased interest in reading by regularly engaging with a variety of books and other reading materials.
- 2. Enhanced literacy skills, including better comprehension, vocabulary, and critical thinking.
- 3. Increased usage of libraries and community reading centers.
- 4. Participants will have a deeper understanding of how literacy and reading contribute to personal and national development.
- 5. Young readers and aspiring writers will be motivated by past successes and milestones, feeling inspired to contribute to the literary community.
- 6. Participants will be aware of the historical achievements of National Book Week and its impact on literacy and reading culture in the Philippines

# Activities

### SIMULTANEOUS ACTIVITIES

- Book picnic- Pack a basket full of your favorite foods and drinks and head to a park for a book picnic. Find a shady spot to relax and enjoy reading in the great outdoors. Ko
- Author Visits and Workshops: Invite local authors or illustrators to speak at your school or library.
  They can share insights into their creative process, read excerpts from their books, and engage
  with the audience through Q&A sessions. Collaborate with local authors to conduct writing
  workshops for aspiring young writers. They can provide tips on storytelling, character
  development, and writing, inspiring students to explore their creativity.
- Book Discussions: Organize book club sessions where students can discuss their favorite books
  or assigned reading materials. This encourages critical thinking, improves communication skills,
  and fosters a love of reading through shared experiences.
- Literary Scavenger Hunt: Create a scavenger hunt with clues about famous books, authors, or literary landmarks. Participants can work individually or in teams to solve the clues and discover hidden treasures related to literature.
- Reading Challenges: Launch a reading challenge where students set personal reading goals and track their progress throughout Book Week. Offer incentives such as certificates or prizes for reaching milestones, and celebrate their achievements at the end of the week.
- Escape Room Challenges- Participants should solve challenges to escape/ get out of the room.
- The Debate Decathlon: Prepare a series of debate prompts that challenge participants to think
  from different perspectives. These prompts could focus on historical events, scientific
  discoveries, or ethical dilemmas. Participants argue both sides of the debate prompt in a roundrobin style competition.
- Bookworm Olympics: Create a series of mini-games related to books and reading.

#### **CONTESTS**

- Digital Poster Making
- Book Trailer Competition: Participants create short video trailers to promote their favorite books, using music, images, and narration to capture the essence of the story and entice viewers to read the book.
- Write your own book story- Let your child come up with a story idea and then help them write it down. They can illustrate their story themselves or ask you for help.
- Local Witty Lines: Hanggang kaibigan Calamba? LumaLaguna na kasi ang feelings ko sa iyo.
   What if Biñan mo ako ng chance.
- 'Piling Magbasa, Pilin and Pilipinas' Advocacy Video Contest- participants will create a video content conveying the message that 'if you choose to read, you choose the Philippines"
